## **Travel**

Located in the heart of the UK, Sheffield is one of England's largest cities, with excellent road, rail and air networks.

Our City Campus is approximately ten minutes from junction 33 of the M1, a two minute walk from Sheffield's railway station and right next to Sheffield's bus and tram transport interchange.

### **By rail**

Sheffield's Train Station is just a two minute walk away from our City Campus

If you are travelling to Sheffield for the conference, and are travelling between London and Sheffield, why not take advantage of our partnership with East Midlands Trains. Discounted fares are available providing great money saving opportunities for getting to Sheffield.

### **By road**

Sheffield's motorway link is the M1, junctions 33 and 34. You are recommended to leave at junction 33 and proceed into the city centre by way of the Parkway (A630).

- Please locate your end destination (car park) and postcode, for your satnav, before setting off

Sheffield's National coach service for long distance travel is comprehensive and efficient. Its central pick up and terminal point is at the transport interchange, just a few short steps from the main Owen Building at our City Campus.

### **By air**

[Doncaster Sheffield Airport](#) is the closest airport to the University providing over 40 destinations across Europe. International connectivity is available via Paris, Amsterdam, Berlin and Dusseldorf with [Flybe](#), and the USA via Dublin with [Aer Lingus](#).

By car or taxi the City Campus is just a 30 minute journey away, alternatively take a taxi or bus to Doncaster rail station and catch the train to Sheffield station, just two minutes from our City Campus. Car hire is also available from the airport.

Manchester, Leeds/Bradford and East Midlands airports are all about an hour's travel time from Sheffield, and easily accessible via regular rail and bus services.

[Manchester Airport](#) is served by many domestic and international carriers, flying to over 200 destinations worldwide, and has a direct rail link to Sheffield both day and night.

Both London airports (Heathrow and Gatwick) are reasonably accessible by rail with just one change of train. We recommend you to allow at least four hours travel time between either of these airports and Sheffield.

### **City Campus Parking**

There are several car parks close to our City Campus. We have discounted parking rates for our visitors at three of the car parks closest to the campus.

- The [Q Park](#) on Charles Street is across the road opposite the Charles Street building. You can park there for just £5.70 (subject to change) when visiting us. Take your ticket to a scanner at the registration desk to claim the discount.
- The [APCOA car park](#) on Eyre Street is a five-minute walk from City Campus. You can park there for just £5.50 (subject to change) when visiting us. Just scan your blue chip at the registration desk to claim the discount
- The [NCP car park](#) on Arundel Gate is a five-minute walk to the Charles Street building. You can park there from just £5.70 on weekdays and £8.20 at weekends (subject to change). To claim this discounted rate, pick up your white ticket at the registration desk or any of the University reception desks. Take the exit towards Arundel Gate to get to our campus

Science Car Park on Arundel Street is also available on a pay and display basis and prices start from £1.00 for 1 hour, up to £5.00 for up to 12 hours.

### **Visitors with disabilities**

City Campus has level or ramped access available and lifts to all floors. Accessible toilets are located on every floor of the Charles Street Building and various other campus buildings. There are Braille lift controls, induction loops in new and refurbished lecture theatres and mini-com facilities at key locations across the campus.

Disabled visitors with mobility problems are advised to contact a member of the events team before visiting so that suitable parking arrangements can be made or advised.

### **About Sheffield**



Located in the heart of the UK, Sheffield is one of England's largest cities, with excellent road, rail and air networks. By train, we're just 2 hours from London, 3.5 hours from Edinburgh and have direct rail links with Manchester Airport. Junction 33 of the M1 is just ten minutes away.

Sheffield is a cultural city, home to the largest theatre complex outside of London and an array of museums and galleries. It's known for producing some of the nation's most celebrated musicians, including acts such as Joe Cocker, Def Leppard, The Human League, Heaven 17, Pulp and the Arctic Monkeys.

One of the greenest cities in Europe, Sheffield is also nicknamed 'the outdoor city', perfect for outdoor adventure and sports enthusiasts. The city itself is full of parks, gardens and wide open spaces. And if that's not enough, a third of the city is situated within the Peak District National Park.

The city has a strong sporting heritage that includes the first official football club – Sheffield FC and two current football league clubs in Sheffield Wednesday and Sheffield United. The World Snooker Championships are also famously played at the Crucible Theatre and the city is also home to professional rugby and ice hockey teams – Sheffield Eagles and Sheffield Steelers respectively.

Sheffield's position in the historic county of Yorkshire, the largest county in England, means a wide range of cultural attractions are within easy reach. The [Visit Sheffield website](#) provides plenty of information on must-see attractions in Sheffield and the surrounding area to help you plan your trip.

From castles to caves, and from woodland to waterfalls, Yorkshire offers some spectacular scenery if you have the time to look around. Alternatively, why not pop into nearby Derbyshire and visit the beautiful Chatsworth House or the famous villages of Bakewell and Castleton.

### **Things to do in Sheffield**

If you are in Sheffield before or after the conference, there are plenty of things to see and do! Sheffield is one of the greenest cities in the UK, with many parks and the city boundaries are within the Peak District National Park. There's an abundance of places to eat and drink in the city centre. If you love to shop Meadowhall shopping centre is a short tram ride away. If the great outdoors appeals, or perhaps a visit to a stately home, the Peak District, Chatsworth House, Haddon Hall and Hardwick are all within a short drive from the city.
