



Submission Guidelines

Our Class Loves This Book Award 2022

Thank you for taking an interest in the UKLA award: *Our Class Loves This Book*. This award asks teachers to explore a book in detail with their classes and encourage children's creative responses to the chosen book.

How to enter

- Submissions can be made by individual teachers, or teachers working with colleagues.
- Choose a book from any of the [shortlisted books in the 2021 book award](#).
- You can choose from any of the books regardless of the age of your students.
- The work undertaken for *Our Class Loves This Book* can be part of a curriculum project, a whole school literacy project, English lessons or simply a book you have enjoyed reading aloud.
- Please ensure that all necessary permissions, particularly about photographs and video, have been sought to allow you to take part - especially from parents/carers and the headteacher.

What to enter

1. The teacher/s involved should provide approximately 500 words, giving background to each class entry alongside examples of pupils' work.
2. Pupils' responses can be evidenced through any media including: writing, music, drama, photography, technology, dance, art, invention, oral presentation etc. by means of written texts, artwork, photography, video/film or any suitable alternative digital form. Please note that digital presentations should be no more than 5 minutes long. The video will need to be saved in an MP4 format as this will ensure it can be played on any computer. Please test that it all works before submitting.

Timeline

- Non-digital entries should be small enough to be posted in an A4 envelope.
- The entry should clearly identify the names and contact details of the teacher/s, class and school.
- All entries will be acknowledged with certificates.
- [Competition winners will be announced at the UKLA International Conference in July 2022.](#) The winning class teachers or a school representative will be invited to attend the UKLA International Conference to share their work in a conference session.

- **All entries must be submitted online or posted to arrive by the end of the Spring Term 2022.**

Important information

- UKLA would like to present work from entries at the UKLA conference in July 2022.
- Please confirm that consent has been given by parents, carers, headteachers etc. for videos being shown in public, and that this is covered by the school Internet safety policy.
- Give consent to videos being shown in public, and confirm that this is covered by the school Internet safety policy.
